CST wins 12' Skiff Interdominion Championships in Geelong

The Sydney crew of Emmett Lazich and Cameron McDonald (CST Composites) won the final Race 8 to take out the 12ft skiff Interdominion crown at the International Skiff Regatta hosted by the Royal Geelong Yacht Club today, however New Zealand retains the Teams trophy for the 10th year running.

A former multiple Moth world champion, Lazich, who is also a successful 49er sailor and coach, won the first three races of the series and backed up with a win today with McDonald to beat their nearest rivals throughout the regatta, the well-sailed Kiwi crew of Chris Reid and Alex Vallings (Nuplex Maersk). Vallings, the defending skipper from 2005-2006.

16' skiff winners Bob Jane T Marts Edgecliff (Lee Knapton/Peter Hubble/Dean Williams) used their CST glass tips for both their No1 and No2 rigs to gain a four point lead over second placed Savage Bee (Bruce Savage/Greg Windust/Damon Zemanek). The results looked to be in doubt following a protest by the second placed boat after a mark rounding incident during the final race. With the protest dismissed Knapton's crew claimed their third 16' skiff National title.

Five 18's made the trip down to Melbourne to race in the International skiff regatta. All the boats were sailing with CST's carbon masts, bowsprits, poles and wings. John 'Herman' Winning Junior managed to get the better of his father 'Woody' to take the top spot and beat his Dad for the gold medal on count back. Also racing on the windward/leeward courses was the 18's builder Brett Van Munster skippering third placed Kinder Caring and CST's Chris Dixon skippering the CST Composites skiff.
